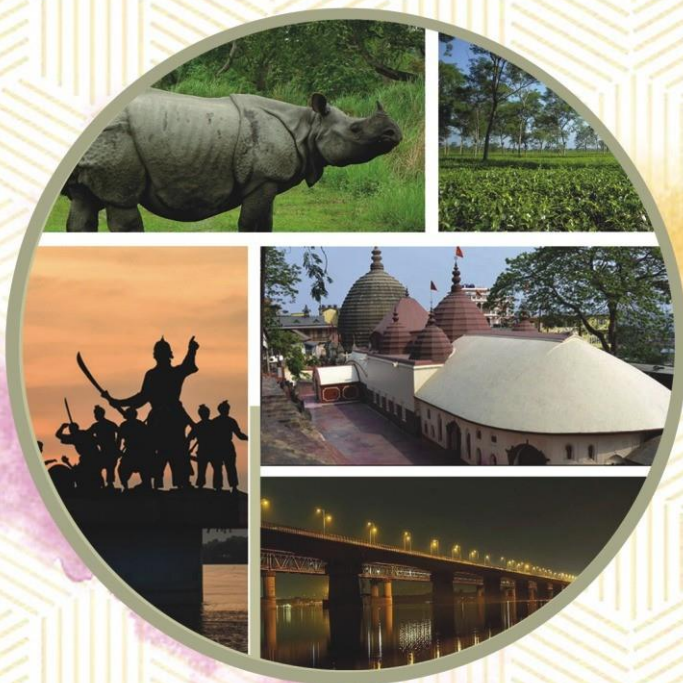

Tourist places in & around Guwahati



Kamakhya Temple

One of the most popular temples of India is Kamakhya Temple. Lakhs of devotees visit the Kamakhya Temple in Guwahati, Assam, every year to pay their respect and offer their devotion to the Goddess Kamakhya. It is one of the oldest temples and is the main one in the complex of 10 temples that are adjoining. The shrine is visited by both Hindu as well as tantric devotees. This widely famous temple is

renowned for its legendary tales and also its architecture. It is on the Nilachal Hill and is a very large complex with 6 temples and 6 monuments within. The Kamakhya Temple, rich with its religious importance and cultural value, was built approximately around the 7th and 8th centuries by several creators and benefactors reigning during that time period. While visiting the Kamakhya Temple, you can enjoy the scenic beauty of the Nilachal Hills and explore the artistic sculptures of the shrine.



Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary

Pobitora or Pabitora Wildlife Sanctuary is a wildlife reserve in the Morigaon district of the state of Assam in India. It is located about 30 km east of Guwahati. The Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary is about 48 km by road from Guwahati.



Umananda Temple

Umananda Devaloi is a Shiva temple located at the Umananda Island in the middle of river Brahmaputra just opposite the office of the Deputy Commissioner of Kamrup or the Kachari Ghat in Guwahati. It is known as smallest inhabited riverine island in the world.



Purva Tirupati Shri Balaji temple

The Tirupati Balaji Temple near Hyderabad is a grand temple that incites reverence and sacredness among all its pilgrims. To give tribute to this legendary temple of South India, a similar temple is built in Assam. This temple is known as Purva Tirupati Shri Balaji Temple. This magnificent temple is located in the city of Guwahati in Assam. The temple is dedicated to the Shri Venkateshwara avatar of Lord Vishnu and is one of the holiest shrines for the Hindu pilgrimage

Shrimanta Shankardeva Kalakshetra

The Kalakshetra was built in the memory of Mahapurusha Srimanta Sankardeva and his contribution towards the spiritual and cultural upliftment of Assam and its people. The institution attempts to preserve, restore, and promote the rich cultural heritage of the diverse ethnic communities inhabiting Assam.



Deepor Beel Wildlife Sanctuary

Deepor Beel (Beel means wetland or large aquatic body in Assamese) located about 10 km Southwest of Guwahati city. It is considered one of the staging sites for migratory birds in India; and some of the large congregations of aquatic birds in Assam during winter. Because of the richness of avian fauna it enjoyed, Deepor Beel has been selected as one of the

Important Bird Area (IBA) sites by Birdlife International. Deepor Beel has also been designated as a Ramsar Site in November 2002.



Brahmaputra Heritage Centre

Under the aegis of Guwahati Metropolitan Development Authority, the entire hillock with the Deputy Commissioner's bungalow perched on top, along with the surrounding grounds have been transformed into the Mahabahu Brahmaputra River Heritage Center, dedicated to the spirit and legacy of the majestic River Brahmaputra



Brahmaputra River Cruise

A cruise ride in the mighty Brahmaputra River at Guwahati, Assam is one of the main attractions and among the popular things to do in Guwahati.

This one hour long cruise is a miniature cruise and great experience with cool breeze on the deck, live music, nice food, serene views and a brief narration on the history and

mythology related to this part of the mighty Brahmaputra River. Evening Cruise on Brahmaputra is one of the most sought after sightseeing activity in Guwahati as it offers the mesmerizing sunset views. The cruise is a compact cultural extravaganza of Assam as it offers live music and dance along with good food. It is one of the best options to go with friends and family. The Dinner Cruise is for about 2 hours and includes a welcome drink, snacks and the dinner.

Cruises on the Brahmaputra River are offered both by Assam Tourism and also by private operators.

Popular Tourist Attractions in Assam



Kaziranga National Park

Home to the largest population of the one-horned rhino on earth, Kaziranga National Park is one of India's national treasures in terms of flora and fauna. The popular national park is also a UNESCO World Heritage Site and houses two-third of the total world population of greater one-horned rhinoceroses. Apart from the one-horned rhinos, the national

park that sprawls in an area of 430 sq km also boasts high density of tigers, and a large breeding ground for elephants, swamp deer, and wild water buffaloes. The national park is also recognized an Important Bird Area (IBA) making it not only an ideal wildlife sighting destination in India but a birdwatcher's paradise as well.

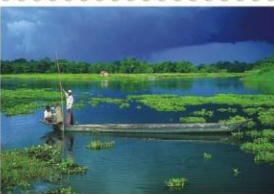
Elephant & Jeep Safari are very popular among tourists and wildlife journalists and enthusiasts. Distance from Guwahati - 210 km by road.



Manas National Park

Manas National Park is a UNESCO Natural World Heritage site, a Project Tiger Reserve, an Elephant Reserve and a Biosphere Reserve in Assam. The only tiger reserve in Assam and also famous for the rare golden langur and the red panda, Manas is one of the best-kept national parks in India.

Manas is recognized not only for its rich biodiversity but also for its spectacular scenery and natural landscape which includes a range of forested hills, alluvial grasslands and tropical evergreen forests. It's home to India's second-largest tiger population. It is also famous for its population of the Wild water buffalo. Manas harbours the maximum number of endangered species from India. One can easily spot rhinos and tigers while sitting on an elephant. Forest officials arrange rides on elephants & Jeep. Distance from Guwahati - 176 km by road.



Majuli

Majuli is a lush green environment-friendly, a pristine and pollution-free freshwater island in the river Brahmaputra, just 20 km from the Jorhat city and located 347 Kms from Guwahati. With a total area of 1250 sq. km, Majuli is the world's largest river island and it attracts tourists from all over the world.

Majuli has been the cultural capital of the Assamese civilization since the 16th century and its main village, Naghmar, hosts all the important events, festivals and prayers. A good learning center for neo-Vaishnavite philosophy, there are 22 Vaishnava Satras in Majuli. The first of which was established in the 15th century by Sankaradeva, the father of Assamese culture. These attract a lot of tourists.

To reach Majuli by train, tourists will have to take trains from Guwahati to reach Jorhat, the nearest railroad to Majuli. From Jorhat, buses and taxis will transport tourists to Neemati Ghat where ferries are available for a ride to Majuli.

Popular Tourist Attractions in Assam



Nameri National Park

The amazing thing about Assam is that you get to explore excellent national parks and sanctuaries in the region. Nameri National Park is among the adventurous places to explore in Assam for wildlife enthusiasts. The park is renowned for Royal Bengal Tigers, Elephants, and other animals such as Leopards, Gaurs, Wild Pigs, and Sambars.

One of the most enjoyable things to do in Assam while in the Nameri Sanctuary is to go for a dauntless safari down its dense bushes and dirt tracks. Apart from its wildlife collection, the park has rich fauna and evergreen vegetation, adding a great appeal to the place.

Distance from Guwahati - 223 km by road

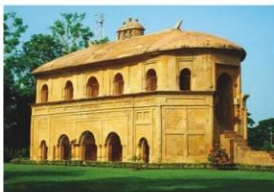


Haflong

The only hill station of Assam and the district headquarters of North Cachar Hills district. Haflong is a beautiful place to unwind with friends and family. Scroll down to know more about its tourist attraction! Haflong hill is a beautiful site to enjoy quality time with your family. Haflong hill is placed at an elevation of about 600 meters above sea level, this hill station

is surrounded by various beautiful lakes, waterfalls, and dense forests. It is located in the Dima Hasao district and offers breathtaking mountain views. Haflong Hill experiences pleasant weather all year round. Haflong Lake is one of the most visited places to visit in Assam. It is a beautiful piece of nature and one of the largest natural water bodies of Assam. During winter thousands of seasonal birds migrate here and make this place heaven for the nature lover. The exquisite attraction of crystal clear waters not just offers visual delight but also attracts tourists to enjoy activities like boating. The surrounding lush greenery of this attraction leaves you in awe of nature.

Sivasagar

One of the holistic towns, Sivasagar formally called as Sibsagar is located in the upper ranges of Assam. This popular destination in Assam is set amidst the rich and diverse biodiversity surrounded by many historic attractions. Tourism in Sivasagar is popular for its Ahom monuments and palaces which are a work of excellence. And circled by the

lovely ambience and graceful hills this place has a number of other attractions as well. Hence, it is a perfect destination to fascinate and engage in the lovely attractions on Sivasagar..

Some of the most popular places here include a water tank called Bhorpukhuri along with Joysagar, a man-made lake, Ahom Museum, Rudrasagar tank and temples, Gaurisagar tank and temples. One can also visit the Kareng Ghar and the Rang Ghar.
